**Apologies:** County Councillor Gibson-Watt sent apologies that he would not be able to attend this evening's meeting.

**Minutes:** These had been agreed as a true record at the meeting in June 2015.

**Chairman's Report 2016:**

First of all, thank you to all Councillors for your support over the past year,

Councillors Fforde, Bate and Thomas have now been with us for over a year.

James Gibson-Watt, our County Councillor, gives us a monthly update of events at County Hall and raises questions on our behalf.

Lisa, our clerk, has also been with us over a year and is becoming very adept with our IT equipment.

We have dealt with 12 planning applications which is 7 less than last year.

Our appointed School Governor, Cllr Brown, keeps us well informed of the state of our primary school, and updates us on progress of the new school.

The Community Council, as usual, sent a donation to the British Legion for Remembrance Day, and Cllr Brown also laid a wreath on our behalf. We also sent a donation to the local Dial A Ride.

Following the December meeting Councillors stayed on for what has now become an annual event, and that is to share a glass or two of wine and a few mince pies to celebrate Christmas.

The footpath to Hay has been cleaned and thanks go to County Councillor Gibson-Watt for his help with this.

Cllr Hood and myself attended the latest consultation meeting for Gwernyfed High School. This was well attended with around 1,000 people. There were a lot of good questions asked by the public, although the panel struggled to answer many of them.

Cllr Hood and myself were shown around the affordable houses by Robert Hughes last week and, although not finished and possible planning issues remaining, the houses seemed to be of a good standard.
