MINUTES

PRESENT: Cllr E Brown (Chairman), Cllr R Wells (Vice Chairman) Cllr P Bate, Cllr G Franks, Cllr J Carter, Cllr V Price and Cllr R Lewis

IN ATTENDANCE: Mr B Morgan, Mr L Cooper and Mr Coles

APOLOGIES: Chairman Brown received and gave apologies from Cllr D Hood and then proceeded to read a letter of resignation from Cllr A Hood with immediate effect. The Clerk will send a letter of thanks to Cllr A Hood.

MINUTES: The Minutes for the September meeting were accepted as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

DECLARATION OF INTEREST: None

RESPONSIBLE PERSON for the duration of this meeting for fire regulations: Chairman Brown who pointed out all fire exits and advised that the meeting point was by the church gate.

COMMUNITY COUNCIL ASSETS: *all were checked this month by Chairman Brown, all in order.*

PLANNING MATTERS: 1. 18/0506/FUL – *No objections*
2. 18/0295/FUL – *No objections*

MATTERS ARISING: 1. Bus stop – *Chairman Brown thanked Cllr Franks for all the work that he has put into this matter. Chairman Brown explained the research that has taken place and has led them to a definitive answer from Brecon Road Policing Unit. Sgt Owen Dillon “Definitely no access to any vehicle other than buses, cars should not use it to short cut the junction or park there.” He will also advise his team to monitor the area when they can, Richard Grant will be the lead officer who will spread the word via Twitter and the Dyfed Powys Police website. Cllr Bate added that if the motorist was prosecuted their defence would ask the local authority for the legal order for change of use of a public road. Cllr Bate believes that this document is not in place, meaning that the motorist will get away with it. Chairman Brown reiterated that it is a Police matter and that we should inform people that the Police are watching. Chairman Brown requested that the Clerk thanks the PCSO’s for their input into this issue.*

2. AED Training – *The Clerk has arranged for Cariat AED training to come to Clyro at 7pm on November 15th. The Clerk was requested to research an appropriate donation to give as Cariat training is a registered charity. The Clerk will invite local groups to attend and Cllrs were requested to pass the word.*

SCHOOL GOVERNORS REPORT: Chairman Brown confirmed that Cllr Lewis is now a Governor for Clyro Church in Wales Primary School representing Clyro Community Council.

POLICE REPORT: No report has been received, the area PCSO’s are not available this evening and two other Police members were invited but could not attend. Chairman Brown requested that the Clerk invite County Cllr William Powell to our next meeting to discuss the lack of Police presence as he sits on the Police and Crime panel.

AOB: Discussion around the vacancy for a Cllr to join the Community Council, Cllrs were asked to encourage all ages to apply and the Clerk was requested to find out the minimum age for a Community Cllr.

Chairman Brown proposed an increase to the usual £25 donation to the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal to cover the cost of a wreath and a donation. The proposal of £50 was voted for and accepted by the Cllrs.

Cllr Bate proposed asking Rhoscoch YFC to report to the Community Council on their activities as it would encourage the young people to engage with the Community Council. All were in favour and Vice Chairman Wells and Cllr Bate will take this forward.

Vice Chairman Wells reported that he has been in touch with Newbridge-on-Wye Post Office to offer the Community Councils support to ensure that the Post Office can function in the Village Hall. The Post Office have updated equipment, so they are hoping that this will alleviate the glitches.

Vice Chairman Wells has discussed the website with Mr Dobson and decided that whilst the website could contain many other attributes it is at this time serving the Community adequately.

The standing orders and code of conduct were discussed as this was an area that Cllr A. Hood was investigating, Chairman Brown agreed to look at them before the next meeting and give feedback.

Mr B. Morgan agreed to send Vice Chairman Wells photos that could be used on the website, he also voiced his concern regarding the bus stop and reiterated Cllr Bate's thoughts on the legal order of the change of use of a public road. Cllr Bate proposed that a letter be sent to Powys asking if the change of use had been completed. Cllr Lewis seconded. The Clerk will action this.
