CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2020: Chairman Wells had circulated his report to Councillors as follows:

As we had a delayed 2020 AGM in December 2020 the 2021 report will only cover the four and a bit months period from January to the present so I would refer back to the Chairs report I presented to Council in December for most of what the council has been up to over the past year. Since Jan 2021 we have continued to meet remotely via Zoom and despite the difficulties of slow and intermittent internet I am been pleased that now all councillors have been able to participate if some only via telephone audio only. We have also welcomed a few members of the public who have attended via Zoom. As well as the normal planning and admin business we have seen play equipment installed and being used in the new play park on Castle Estate, speedy progress of the new social housing development Dan y Castell and anti dog fouling signage in the village. In January we bid farewell to one of the longest standing Councillors - Cllr David Hood who resigned after more than 30 years serving the parish during which time he held the post of both Chair and Vice Chair. After due process in April we were joined via co-option by Cllr Jasper Fforde who we are pleased to welcome back as he had previously served as Councillor (and briefly interim clerk). I look forward to working with him again in the Council. As I am stepping down as Chair at this AGM I would like to express my thanks to all councillors for their contributions and support during my two year Chairmanship. Special mentions to Cllr Brown our previous chair who proposed me in the first place and has guided me in my first Chairman's role, also to Cllr Rodi Lewis who as Vice Chair has always supported me, Cllr Jennie Morgan who with myself headed the Covid19 response and community support and generously allowed us to use her Zoom license to hold meetings. Thanks Jennie. Finally but by no means least our great clerk Diane Workman who has managed Clyro Community Council through the difficult period of Covid and continues to work diligently on behalf of the council and our community. Personally I plan - subject to the agreement of council - to continue as councillor and website manager and will continue to provide liaison with the play park project and will happily give my support to the new Chair and Vice Chair.
