

CLYRO COMMUNITY COUNCIL
meeting held at the Village Hall.
Tuesday 12th August 2025, at 7pm.

MINUTES

PRESENT: Cllr J Fforde (Chair), Cllr A Crichton-Stuart (Vice-Chair), Cllr J Morgan, and Clerk to the Community Council, D Workman.

APOLOGIES: Cllr P Bate, Cllr V Price and Cllr R Wells.

IN ATTENDANCE: Mrs V Williams

MINUTES: The minutes from July's meeting were agreed as a true record.

DECLARATION OF INTEREST: No declarations of interest were expressed

COMMUNITY COUNCIL ASSETS: Chair Fforde has checked all assets and found to be in good order. Chair Fforde requested that the second SID was added to the assets register.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Mrs V Williams offered to help with the distribution of leaflets, Vice-chair Crichton-Stuart thanked her and agreed to contact her to arrange this. Mrs V Williams left the meeting.

MATTERS ARISING:

1. Website sign-up leaflet – Vice-chair Crichton-Stuart brought the leaflets and Cllrs were pleased with the design and thanked Vice-chair Crichton-Stuart. Discussion ensued around the distribution of these, and it was agreed that Vice-chair Crichton-Stuart would formulate a plan in readiness for next months meeting or before if possible.
2. Cllrs expense declarations – Cllr Bate was not in attendance to complete this item.
3. Defibrillator Update – New pads have been installed.

MEMBERSHIP:

1. Casual vacancies for Community Councillors – Chair Fforde told the meeting that there are still three vacancies for Cllrs.

COMMUNITY AND ENVIRONMENT:

1. Dan Y Castell Play Area and Community Garden – A meeting has been held with Powys County Council regarding an accessible path to the lower part of the community garden.
2. Clyro traffic calming/cycle route subcommittee – Chair Fforde reported that the second SID has been installed and working well. The location of the SID by the school gives drivers an extra reminder about the 20mph at school drop off and pick up times. The quarterly report from SID 1 can be read in appendix A. Chair Fforde and

Cllr Wells are looking at extending the footway from Clyro to Glasbury, there is a length of footway that runs part of the way so with the active travel consultation looking for routes to enhance this could be a valuable addition to give a way of walking from Clyro to Talgarth.

3. Meet the Community Council Event – Cllr Bate is leading on this item, so Cllrs agreed to discuss this at September’s meeting.
4. 2026 projects – Cllrs were asked for ideas to benefit the community going forward, the questionnaire that residents completed didn’t give any new ideas that the community council could implement. Cllrs will bring ideas to the September meeting.

PLANNING MATTERS inc decisions and updates:

1. **Application:** Reference, 25/0945/HH, replacement of existing single storey carport and deck over with two side storey extension and associated works. Site address, 21 Begwyns Bluff, Clyro, HR3 5SR. The community council had no comment to make.
2. **Application:** Reference, 25/0955/TRE, trimming of two trees (one willow tree) within a conservation area. Location, Valley View, Clyro, HR3 5RZ. The community council had no comment to make.

CORRESPONDENCE (incl):

1. Help shape the Active Travel Network in Powys – Cllrs were encouraged to take part in the consultation.

FINANCIAL: Bank balances: Current £5,935.23 (on 4th June 2025) Reserve £1,908.58 (on 4th June 2025). Payments to include BT direct debit 8/08/25 (£50.34), Defibrillator Pads (£167.46) and Clerks Salary (£206.88). Chair Fforde proposed paying these invoices, Cllr Morgan seconded, and all Cllrs agreed.

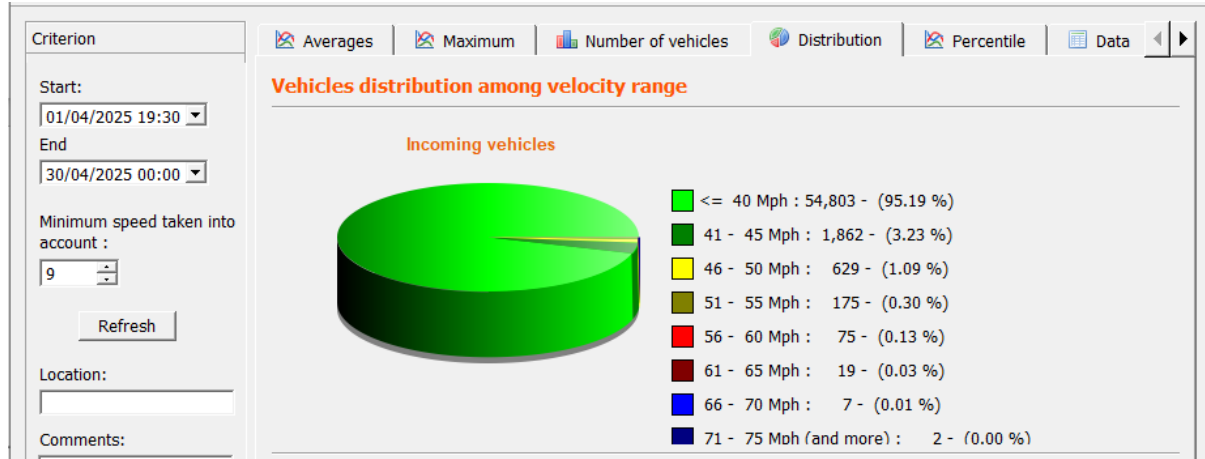
A.O.B: No items were discussed.
